Last spring, nearly 100 volunteers split up and picked up trash on the township roads of six east Geauga townships. They will be doing the same this Saturday morning (September 30). Last spring offered non-stop rain but, they stuck with it anyway as they covered over 70 miles of roads. They are a tough group that doesn't let non-stop rain deter them! Our Budget

We've been rather careful with our expenditures. For a few years now, we have been holding back on certain purchases and projects because the Taylor Wells resurfacing project was projected to be very high. Once the bids came in and we discovered the lowest bid (Cole Burton Contractors out of Newbury) was much lower than the projections, it made my heart sing! Once the project commenced, we still held back on spending because of potential cost overruns. After the project was finished and we were sent the final bill which included work changes, we discovered that the final invoice was over \$50,000.00 lower than the original bid. My heart sang again! Cole Burton did a very good job. With that said, we find that we now have the funds to do the things we held off on. We are purchasing needed equipment, restoring at least one of our cemeteries (Center Cemetery), created Township brochures and we even have enough to resurface (with pavement!) the

next road on the list (Hall road). We will also be redoing the maintenance building roof which we've been patching for several years. There are other projects we have in mind however, the details have yet to be worked out. Regardless of the extra money we currently have due to the staving off spending the last several years, we still don't have enough to do everything we wish to do so we will continue to spend wisely.

Winter Snow and Our Roads

This upcoming winter, we will be contracting with the Geauga County Engineer's office to plow our through roads once again. The Claridon Board of Trustees have interest in plowing our through roads in-house however, because of certain circumstances at the moment, they will stick with the Engineer's office this winter season. As of the last time numbers were crunched, it is over \$2,000 cheaper to do so. It is strongly suggested that residents construct snow plow guards to protect their mailboxes.
